There have been migrants and refugees throughout history: men, women and children trudging along with bundles on their back, in wagons or prams; or overloaded boats at sea.

Some flee from unbearable conditions, hoping for anything. Others leave unsatisfactory conditions, hoping for something better. Both aim towards a goal, motivated by hope. Humanly speaking the problem is insoluble, or at best highly complex, but it is not new.

The Israelites were refugees from slavery in Egypt, but at the beginning and the end of their quest was the promise and provision of God – with a history-changing consequence. Elijah fled the wrath of Jezebel, to rescue his life from her hand and to place it into God's.

We cannot always assess what motivates a refugee's action, but God can. Nations cannot usually accept all who turn up at their borders – but God can and does.

Jesus said: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Matt 11:28-30). Praise God that those words are still true, powerful and effective!

## Hungry to know more about Jesus

Nabil is a Tunisian man who came to know Jesus while he was studying abroad. After returning to Tunisia he contacted the Arab Vision follow-up team asking if we could put him in touch with local Christians. The team sent him the details of a respected church and also contacted the pastor with the information. A week later the pastor shared with us that his contact with Nabil was very fruitful. Nabil had travelled 4 hours in bad weather to meet him. He was hungry to know more about Jesus and to learn about prayer. Nabil also shared with us how much he appreciated our work for him.

Our follow-up team is daily in touch with dozens of people who want to know more about Jesus. In our previous newsletter we wrote about the growing trend of atheism in the Arab World, but at the same time thousands of people are looking for answers in the Christian faith.

The team earnestly prays for everyone with whom they are in contact. Someone who recently attended one of their prayer times wrote: "Prayer time with the follow-up team is so special, they are really devoted. While they were praying today I could clearly feel the power of God being present in the room."

Please continue to pray for much wisdom and discernment for the team.

## Turn to Jesus ...

Marwa is a young Muslim lady who became suicidal because of some problems in her life. She has a Christian friend who suggested that she pray in the name of Jesus. Marwa was too afraid to do this and her problems worsened. Her Christian friend continued to encourage her to turn to Jesus and suggested that she read the Bible from the internet and learn about the Christian faith through Christian satellite TV channels. She began to do this and contacted us using the follow-up information on one of our programs. Our team has been helping her to understand the Gospel and is now discussing baptism with her.

## Women in the Bible

In our March newsletter we interviewed the scriptwriter of our new program series *Women in the Bible*. The scripts are now finished and we will soon start producing the series. The following is from one of the episodes in the series.

Early in the morning two women are walking on the road. One (Z) is Zebedee's wife, mother of James and John. The other (Y) is Yossi, one of the many women who followed Jesus to Jerusalem. This is an excerpt from their conversation, based on Matthew 20: 17-28.

Z: "Look, I am not going to ask him for anything for myself, only for my boys. There is nothing wrong with that!"

Y: "Wrong? What exactly are you going to ask him for?"

Z: "Look, I'll tell you, but I need to tell James and John first."

Y: "Wait. I really wonder about your request and I'm not at ease about it."

Z: "Do you know what my request is going to be then?"

Y: "No, but I am uncomfortable with it. I feel it's not the right time to request something for your sons."

Z: "Why not? It's for them; they left their jobs and followed him for three years."

Y: "Yes, but so did all of them."

Z: "But don't forget that we are related to him, so he won't refuse my request."

Y: "But he once said that anyone who does the will of the Heavenly Father is his relative."

Z: "I will no longer talk to you! Together with my sons I'll go to him and will request something good for them."

Through this series Arab Vision wants to highlight the role of women in both the Old and the New Testament in God's salvation history. The programs will be filmed in Egypt and Jordan. Please pray for safety and creativity of our production crew.
