Foreword

"Ibrahim called the follow up team after he watched "Hope for Tomorrow" program. He told us how he loves Christianity and how when listening to Christian songs and programs he gets that feeling of peace, comfort and joy. He told us that when he reads the Bible he finds it to be full of love. We talked with him about Jesus and His redemption and he was very accepting to what we told him. He also shared with us that he has a cross in his house, which gave us the opportunity to talk to him about the meaning of the cross. We shared with him how the cross is a symbol of Christ's love and sacrifice for us."



This is one of the many stories that our follow-up team shared with us. It is amazing what the Lord has been doing in the Arab World through Arab Vision programs. There is a huge need for love, hope and peace. The violence in the Middle East makes people rethink their faith, lives, culture and way of living. People want to feel loved, have hope, joy and a brighter future. Most of our programs talk about these matters; they attract our listeners to sit and watch because we cover subjects that are important to their lives. Whether the programs talk about love, peace, corruption, women rights, advocacy, youth and God's plan for us, they sit and listen because there is a great hunger.

When I get the reports and the board papers from our staff, I go directly to the follow up report, because I want to hear the stories, I want to be blessed by what God is doing. I feel encouraged, excited and want to do more. Vision and Mission

Vision Statement

We envision an Arab World with, in each People Group, an increasing number of vibrant Churches that play a strategic public role in shaping their societies in accordance with the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ.



With the term 'Arab World' we mean the countries of the Arabian Peninsula, the Middle East and North Africa, where Arabic is the first official language of the state. We recognize that the Arab World consists of many different people groups, and we hold that these are entitled to hearing the Gospel in their own languages.

Mission Statement

Arab Vision is a community of Christians committed to changing individuals and societies through the Gospel of Jesus Christ, by producing and distributing effective Christian video programs, using appropriate media for various target audiences in the languages of the peoples of the Arab World.

Productions and Training

It is Arab Vision's goal to produce quality programs that are thoughtprovoking and tailor made for different audiences.

In 2015 we produced approximately 1.5 hours in North African languages and 26.6 hours in the languages of the Middle East. This brings the total for 2015 to 28.1 hours.

Productions in 2015 included:

- 14 films of 25 minutes about human rights of minorities, plus a 5 min clip for internet
- Fear and Hope: 3 episodes of 30 min focusing on the suffering of people in the present time and the fear and hopes people had at the time of Christ's birth. Watch a short clip of Fear and Hope.
- 26 episodes of 20 minutes: Kingdom Person; a programme about living out Biblical principles in everyday life based on the book Kingdom Person. (Each episode is 15 min plus 5 min clips for use on social media). Watch an episode of Kingdom Person.





❖ 13 episodes of 25 minutes: The Quest; interactive programme for teenagers to discover their Christian heritage and their identity. Two groups of teens are camping together and travelling. Meantime they need to solve puzzles and answer questions in order to find places in Egypt and discover the relation to the Bible or Christian history. A special website was developed, plus Facebook page, Instagram, twitter account and YouTube channel to reach the young audience and get them involved with the program. Watch a clip of the Quest. ❖ 52 episodes of 3 min clips: Speaking the truth in love. A program with a well known Bible teacher who presents issues like the credibility of the Bible, who is Jesus, what is the trinity, etc. He presents them in a non-confrontational way inviting the viewers to come with questions. Watch one episode of Speaking the truth.



- ❖ 75 min of the program Women in the Bible was filmed. The program is about women in the Old and New Testament. Production will be finished in 2016.
- 10 min documentary about improving methods of agriculture for NGO, plus 3 min clip.
- 25 episodes of 15 minutes: parables of Jesus told, in a modern setting, including drama - in the Kabyle language- was finalized and subtitled in Arabic. Watch the episode about the lost coin.
- ❖ 10 testimonial programs of 10 minutes by North Africans in the French, Kabyle and North African Arabic languages were pre-produced.

Staff-training



Several staff members were trained in the use of tools for social media.

The follow up team received training in using special software and applications plus training and teaching in how to answer certain questions from viewers.

Editing staff received several days' training in working with advanced editing software.




Distribution

In 2015 Arab Vision's programs were aired on 7 satellite channels (2014:7) and some non-satellite channels throughout the year.

The total broadcast of new programs was around 418,5 hours, (2014: 330) and the re-airing of programs produced in the past year(s) added up to 385,15 hours (2014:228).

Many of our new and older programs were available on the internet through YouTube and as streaming videos on websites. With the development of new/social media we are increasingly able to reach more people.





Follow Up

Arab Vision's follow up team consists of 7 people and has its basis in the Middle East. The team is connected to other follow up teams in the region. Viewers of our TV programs were able to reach a follow up worker 7 days per week, 10 hours per day.

In 2015 we continued to expand our follow up activities by opening Facebook pages for each finished production, besides using email and mobile telephone as means of responding to our team. In this way viewers are invited to interact with follow up workers, and with other viewers of the programs.

We have also opened a more general Facebook page on which we post clips of our previously produced programs in order to reach more people with the gospel and to provide follow up to those who are looking for prayer and counsel.

Audience response figures for 2015: Facebook likes and shares totalled in tens of thousands. Numbers of phone calls were much lower, but often resulted in one-to-one long lasting contacts.

Many people call or send messages to our team, asking for prayer; prayer for relatives who have problems, for greater faith, for healing, wisdom for raising the children, for relationships that have deteriorated, etc.

In the coming years social media will be developed further as a vital means for follow up.



Viewers respond



"I am 32 years old. I grew up in a Muslim family, but when I was a teenager I started to have lots of questions about my faith. I used to talk to my aunt about all the confusion I was going through. I had been in touch with Christians and respected them

for their lifestyle and good values.

One evening last year, I started watching Christian TV channels and for the first time I heard about Christianity and what it means. After having watched some programs I decided to call the telephone number that was shown. A man talked to me, explained things to me and prayed with me. That day I accepted the Lord Jesus as my Saviour. Since that time I have been learning more and more about Jesus!"

Turn to Jesus ...

Marwa is a young Muslim lady who became suicidal because of some problems in her life. She has a Christian friend who suggested that she pray in the name of Jesus. Marwa was too afraid to do this and her problems worsened. Her Christian friend continued to encourage

her to turn to Jesus. She suggested that Marwa read the Bible from the internet and learn about the Christian faith through Christian satellite TV channels. She began to do this and contacted us using the follow-up information on one of our programmes. Our team has been helping her to understand the Gospel and is now discussing baptism with her.



"Could you please pray for me and my wife? I have had four dreams about Jesus and decided to join my wife in going to church. Now my family has discovered this and attacked me. We had to move out of the city. I am reading the Bible now and I'm waiting on God to speak to us."






Sources of Income

The Board of Arab Vision

In 2015 the International Board of Arab Vision met for 4 days: 2 days in April and 2 days in December.

The Board ensures that the International Director, who is a non-voting member of the Board, continues to keep Arab Vision focused on its organizational mission, vision and goals. The Board also ensures that all assets and income of the organization are used to the maximum, and only for fulfilling the goals of the organization.

Presently the constitution of the Board writes the following on the make-up of the Board:

- The Board is composed of a minimum of five elected members with full voting rights
- ➤ The majority of the elected members are natives from different Arab countries and representing different denominations
- From among these elected members, the Board appoints a Chairperson, a Vice-Chairperson, a Secretary and a Treasurer.

Beside this, the supporting Arab Vision organizations in the USA, the UK and The Netherlands are entitled to one seat in the International Board. These Board members have full voting rights in the International Board meetings. In 2015 the International Board consisted of five Board members, from Palestine, Egypt, Brazil, The Netherlands, and United Kingdom.
