
## Meeting real needs in the Arab world

*Follow-up team busy answering requests for help*

Each month, thousands of Arabs contact us after seeing our programs. Of those, about 500 people contact our follow-up team by phone to ask for prayer or to ask questions about the Christian faith. In addition, a lot of feedback is received through "contact us" forms or via emails.

This response from Saudi Arabia is just one of many we receive each month:

*I am calling to ask you for help and advice. I am a Muslim person and I have a deep faith in Christianity. I watched your program for years. I know Jesus is the true way; He is the truth. I love Him, worship Him in my heart, read the Bible, pray and talk to Him.*



One of the goals of our follow-up team is to arrange face-to-face meetings with those in need. That is the best way to help people. Our team often refers people to pastors, pastoral workers, or other professional counselors.

As the programming all over the Arab world, as well as Europe, Australia and the U.S. increases, the responses will also increase, and more and more Arabs will be reached at their area of need. Pray for our audience response team please, that their work will be effective, and please the Lord.

## Helping a woman with family problems

One of our Arab viewers in Switzerland (yes, even in Europe, Arabs watch our programs!) was in deep emotional distress and in the middle of a family crisis. After watching one of our programs on television, she called our follow-up team. It was immediately clear that more intense counseling was needed. As a result, she was connected with a more experienced counselor.



The amazing thing is that, unknown to our follow-up team member, the counselor to whom she referred the woman had previously lived in Switzerland and was able to direct her to a church and other people in Switzerland who were able to help her best in her areas of need.

The woman called the follow-up team back a short while later to thank them for all their help and mentioned how her life changed because of them.

# Defending human rights for Arab Christians


Although Egypt and other Arab states have signed the United Nations Charter for Human Rights, too many Arab regimes have chosen not to apply this to their Christian citizens. In Egypt, for instance, Christians are treated as second class citizens. The latest major incident, the brutal murder of six Christians in front of their church in Nag'a Hamadi on 6 January, attracted wide international attention. Christians in Egypt face discrimination in education, employment and military service, problems with church buildings, violence against their property, unjust police practices and intimidation, and as we saw, even murder. In particular, the situation of Muslim converts to the Christian faith is especially worrying.

Arab Vision will, therefore, in 2010 produce a TV series of 13 documentaries that focus public attention on human rights violations against Christians, and they call the audience to action for implementing an acceptable set of human rights principles in the Arab World.

We will focus on specific human rights issues:

- + Abolishing notification of religion in passports, ID cards and other documentation
- + Encouragement of governments to have one law concerning the building and repair of mosques and churches
- + Right of children to citizenship of their mother's nationality
- + Right of children to study religions other than Islam in school
- + Improving access to employment, education and social benefits among religious minorities in the Middle East and North Africa.

# Moroccan Muslim turns to Christ

"I did not have a very happy childhood because my mother was a very hard woman and my father died when I was very young. I had to go to work, even though I was very young. When I finally did go to school, I was much older than the other students.



I was particularly fond of reading and I read a book about the life of Jesus and I admired him greatly and saw him as a hero. I began to compare the life of Mohammed with that of Jesus and I came to the conclusion that Mohammed could not be a prophet of God. I stopped praying and fasting and felt very guilty about this, but I couldn't talk to anyone about this. Deeply troubled, I attempted to commit suicide and was very annoyed at my failure.

Shortly after my suicide attempt, I had to go to a funeral and this caused me to return to religion. I read all kinds of Islamic books, but I also read a book that talked about the meaning of the Gospel.

I started going to internet cafes to look at Christian websites and I left messages for people to contact me. I was delighted to meet a Moroccan Christian through this.

I was afraid that my family would find out about my newfound faith, but I am so happy to start this new life and I now have many Christian friends."

## Journey through Art

# A day in the life of an Arab woman

Generally speaking, when an Arab woman gets married and has children, her husband goes off to work and she stays home with her children. The potential is there for her to have a very isolated life revolving around her children and home. To keep herself entertained, she watches TV and, as a result of this need, we broadcast programs of interest to her. She would like to watch wholesome shows, no violence, so our kind of programming definitely appeals to her. Some of the programs cover women's rights, children's rights, handicapped children, and most also point clearly to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

In addition, some of the programs are aimed at teens. These shows are high energy, with moral lessons and also have a small segment in which an adult leads discussions and Biblical values and insights are communicated. Some shows are about parenting, how to teach Christian parents to raise children in a Christian context in an Arab world, some are testimony programs where the host prays with viewers. These really touch the women's hearts.



## The Lord answered my prayer...

I have come to know Christ through your programs. While I was watching one day I had a wonderful experience, while the guest in the show was giving a testimony about a girl that her parents wanted to force into marriage. This testimony was exactly my story too. When I heard your advice on how to ask Christ to help through prayer, I also prayed to Jesus and asked that He would free me from this forced marriage that I was facing. Not too long after, the Lord answered my prayer. I have tasted the answers to prayer, and I did pray again especially on one occasion when I had a twisted ankle, I prayed and asked Jesus to heal me and he did it instantly.
