The good news

In 1997 Arab Vision started producing TV programs for the Arab World. The first newsletter on paper was published in [December 2006](#).

Abu Banaat, the founder of Arab Vision, wrote: *“We have a good story to tell! The good news that many Muslims from all over the Arab World respond positively to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Each month, over 2500 Arabs respond to our*

programs. Dozens of them tell us that they have been found by God through the Lord Jesus Christ through our programs.”

Principles and practice of reconciliation



We are busy working on the production of a documentary of 45 minutes (to be cut in three episodes of 15 minutes) on reconciliation in cooperation with [Musalaha](#), an organisation in Jerusalem which has been working with Palestinian Christians and Messianic Jews since 1990 to promote reconciliation between Israelis and Palestinians according to biblical principles. Goal of the project is to evoke awareness and discussion in the Arab World about biblical reconciliation principles.

All the footage that was shot in September now needs to be edited. The languages of the program will be Arabic and Hebrew, subtitled in Arabic where Hebrew is being spoken, and the other way around. We also hope to subtitle the program in English. So, it is still quite a job to get this finished but we are looking forward to an important documentary that will be thought-provoking and attitude-changing in the Arab World. International board meetings

Please pray for our bi-annual international board meetings that will be held on 4&5 October in the Middle East. Pray for safe travel, for our time of evaluation, planning, prayer, and sharing. This is a particularly special meeting as we will welcome our recently appointed international director! She (yes, a lady again ☺) will replace Umm al Farieq, who recently stepped back from the international director’s position. The new ID will start working on a part-time basis from 1 October, followed by a full-time assignment as from January 2017. She will be further introduced in our next newsletters.

Youth hold the key

The majority of the population in many Arab countries is youth under 25 years old. Do they feel they matter in church? Do they feel they can have a say in how the churches view a Christian life style, communication with God, being called by God? Or are they considered too young, not yet mature - by themselves and/or by the Arab church leadership and other adults?

Arab Vision is developing a TV programme series about young people in the Bible and how they were used in God's plans, called, taken seriously... and about how this had a great impact on their and other people's lives. The programs will also apply the stories and lessons learned to daily (family) life.
