## Embrace hope! Embrace life!

"Death to the Shia!" calls a Sunni Muslim and a car bomb attack kills 38 people in a Shia area of Baghdad. "Death to the Sunni!" calls a Shia suicide bomber and kills 68 people in a Sunni mosque in Iraq. "Death to the kufaar – the unbelievers!" shouts the IS warrior and down comes his sword for another beheading. "Death to the Jews!" say two

Palestinian men who enter a synagogue in Jerusalem and kill five people there. "Death to Arabs!" scrawls a settler on the wall of a house in a Palestinian village and burns it down.

The list can go on and on, so does the cycle of violence and death. Thousands of people are imprisoned by contempt and hatred for 'the other', often coupled with racist and/ or religious views, resulting in growing polarisation, not only affecting the Arab World, but also many parts of the Western world.

It feels rather naive - almost alien - to write about reconciliation, a **life-giving movement** in which relationships are restored and lives are healed.

For more than 20 years the Musalaha (Reconciliation) movement in Jerusalem has been working with Palestinian and Israeli believers in Jesus. The work is based on the

belief that Christ's death and resurrection is the foundation of reconciliation, and that forgiveness and healing can only come through following His example and obeying His word.



Arab Vision, in partnership with Musalaha, is planning the production of a 45 minute documentary focusing on the teaching of biblical principles of reconciliation, including some of Musalaha's activities, testimonies of participants and comments from Christian leaders on both sides. It will be produced in two languages, Arabic and Hebrew, and subtitled in English.

# **Media for Change**

## **New productions:**

#### **Christian apologetics:** Sharing the Gospel now

Who is God, what is He like? Why do Christians believe in three gods? Who is Jesus and what is so unique about him? Where does Mary fit in the picture? Do Christians actually pray and fast? If so, how, when and why? These are just a few questions that Muslims often ask about the Christian faith. The goal of this new series is to explain the truths of the Christian faith in a clear but inviting way. Muslims who have been taught Islam and the Qur'an throughout their lives can find these biblical principles hard to accept. The presenter of the program is a Christian from a Muslim background. The series consists of 13 episodes of 12-15 minutes each. Follow up will be done through email, phone and social media.

#### Women in the life of Christ Biblical Insights for Modern Times

Jesus' treatment of women was revolutionary, breaking the social norms of His times. Even the earliest biblical records of Christ's interactions with women give primary evidence that He treated all women with respect, affording them dignity and special standing that was unheard of at the time.

## Christ's life is an effective model for Arab men and women to follow.

The focus of this series will be on women Jesus encountered in His life on earth. We will look at Mary the mother of Jesus; Mary and Martha, sisters of Lazarus; the Samaritan woman; Mary Magdalene; the woman with the issue of blood and others.

Christ recognised the immense value of each woman and showed the extent of God's own appreciation for her in the circumstances in her life.


The series consists of two parts: the first part is about women in Christ's life. The second part will be about women from the Old Testament. Each part will consist of 13 episodes of about half an hour.

## Embrace hope! Embrace life! - continued

After the July war in Gaza, Salim Munayer, director of Musalaha, writes, "The last cycle of violence has affected our societies; some feel betrayed, some are depressed, and others feel their principles have been compromised. Some are expressing themselves with bitterness and hate for the other side. Both Israelis and Palestinians feel they have lost their joy, and are questioning the future."



In a conflict situation the other party is too often regarded as inferior or is even dehumanised. However, getting involved with "the other", really listening and establishing a relationship is a long, fragile and difficult process which suffers setbacks and requires persistence.

Musalaha organises activities in which children learn to relate to children from "the other side" and play together; young people hike in the desert and have to learn to rely on each other and trust each other; women meet together and share one another's sorrows and pain. People are brought together so that relationships can be established and nurtured.


"Right now, our challenge is to hold on to hope," Salim continues in his article. "Hope is the refusal to accept the current destructive reality. When we continue to talk about reconciliation, we continue to embrace hope. We continue to believe in the possibility of a better present. We want to speak peace, seek peace, and maintain our hope."

## **Media Training:**

The 'facebook-generation' is very involved with society and dreams about change, fairness and openness but their voice is rarely heard above the official, state-controlled media in the Arab World. Arab Vision believes in diversity in society and is not afraid to give people a voice. It puts this into practice by providing media training for young adults. The training covers various essential aspects of filming and editing of short videoclips which can be posted on social media. As a final assignment students are asked to produce a short video-clip in which they show that they have mastered the skills that have been taught.



One of the trainees writes:

"This training is for us very important! We often use video without the know-how so when we heard about the training we went and we are very excited with this team of professional trainers with great experience. They were willing to give us experience in the field of directing, photography and editing; how to make a movie and show it to the world. After the theoretical part we were

asked by the trainers to make a movie and present it. We wrote a story, shot, directed, and edited it. I had some experience in working with video, but when I attended this training, I felt fantastic, it was all very useful. The script I wrote was quite complicated, but I got much help from the trainers and it was a success for me and my group."

# The truth about my faith in the Sourani language

Some time ago we produced an evangelistic series in the Sourani language, the main language of Kurdistan. Topics included *Was the bible corrupted? How could Jesus be born as a man and be truly God?* and *The cross and the resurrection*. It is a series of 33 episodes of 25 minutes each. We are in need of funds to broadcast the series, to re-shape the programs to use them for internet campaigns (YouTube and Facebook), and to arrange effective follow-up. We regularly receive donations, marked as 'where most needed', and we often use those donations to cover the cost of our follow-up ministry, as this cost is not covered by designated funds.

## **Questions to Umm al Farieq**

Why does Arab Vision ask for money? Why don't broadcasters pay for the productions? The organisations which broadcast our programs often have to raise funds to cover the costs of broadcasting, and some of them also produce programs which stretches their resources even further. Sometimes we share the costs for producing a program, like we do with SAT-7 for the Christmas program. There is a huge demand for authentic programs in



Arabic and the other languages spoken in the Arab World. If we could produce more programs they would all be welcomed by the broadcasters.

What are the developments on the Hope for Somalia project? The series of evangelistic programs in the Somali language which we planned to produce has met with considerable delay and we are not quite certain yet whether we can actually produce the series. Would you please pray for this project? This would be the first series of programs in which the Gospel will be explained by a Somali Christian. Please join us in prayer!

## Thinking outside the box

In some countries of the Arab World the educational systems are focused on learning by rote, without teaching students to understand or reason. This has disastrous consequences for their development. They don't learn to think about choices, develop alternative solutions or to plan ahead which may result in anger and frustration when faced with challenges in later life. Arab Vision is involved in developing TV news programs for children and teenagers to teach them to form their own opinions about issues in life and world events. Among more than 15 contributions, Arab Vision's pilot program was awarded first prize by a children's jury. We expect to start the production of these programs in the near future.
