Partner in our project Peace in a broken (Arab) World

Our Arab colleagues in the Middle East are now producing a programme series focussing on the concept of peace. The peace that only comes from our heavenly Father through his Son Jesus Christ entails so much more than the absence of war and conflict. It means abundant life, a deeply experienced wholeness. Biblical notions on peace are shared through brief meditations and music videos: 15 episodes and 30 songs. Our social media team is preparing for sharing the programmes on social media platforms and Youtube, and our follow-up team is ready to listen to responders, take them on a journey to a better understanding of God's peace. Our satellite TV broadcasting partners will broadcast the series as well. Cost including production, social media campaigns and follow-up are £12,300, of which £6,200 has been donated already. We still need £400 per episode.









Conflicts and hope in the Arab World

Today we are witnessing what is almost a competition for visibility in the international media, as there are so many conflicts going on at the same time. For months the war in Ukraine controlled the headlines, until the vicious attack of Hamas on Israel on 7 October, and the massive killing of Palestinians after that.

Eleven years of conflict in Syria has caused the biggest refugee crisis in our time. More than fourteen million Syrians have been fleeing from the ongoing violence; this is about half of the Syrian population. For many, many Syrians this means a decade of unimaginable suffering, and the end is not in sight yet.

Sudan

Who has any idea about what is going on in Sudan, where more than ten thousand people were killed in the past six months, and another six and a half million displaced? Darfur, scene of war and genocide 20 years ago, has become a region from where hundreds of thousands of people have been fleeing again.


Yemen

In Yemen an almost forgotten war is going on as well - More than eight years ago, Houthi militias took control of the capital Sana'a. That moment marks the beginning of a long and complex conflict between different parties. The Houthis are fighting the anti-Houthi coalition, which includes the Yemeni government, supported by Saudi Arabia. The war has had disastrous consequences for the people of Yemen. Three quarters of the population is dependent on humanitarian aid and more than four million Yemenis have fled. Much food has become unaffordable, people are malnourished and diseases such as cholera and corona are spreading rapidly. According to the United Nations, the world's worst humanitarian crisis is in Yemen.



Arab Vision's follow-up team tirelessly works to interact with people responding to our social media posts and videos. The interaction may vary from a as a response to a positive remark, to a long-lasting online relationship. Heartbreaking stories about domestic violence, and joyful stories about having become a follower of Christ are shared.

Anwar from Algeria responds to a programme about 'Forgiveness'. Our counsellor asks him whether he knows Jesus. To his surprise Anwar tells him that ten years ago he decided to become a follower of Christ, but until now he has not been baptised. He really want to take that step but feels too shy to take that step. "Please pray for me, that I will find the courage to follow my desire to be baptised", Anwar asked. Will you join us in that prayer?

Thousands of online conversations, long and short, take place each month. Our follow-up workers have a lot on their plate, and they cope by sharing a lot with each other, by intervision with other follow-up teams in the region, and by ongoing training.



A typical month shows these impact figures:

21356 unique private messages

4723 online conversations

1036 people being counselled

1001 Bibles and/or Christian materials sent

1 or 2 confessions of faith

1 or 2 individuals referred to a face-to-face contact or a local church
